Plainfield Food Security Project is Moving

You may know that we have worked to help alleviate hunger for thousands of families in a partnership with the Plainfield YMCA through a project called Plainfield Food Security or PFSP. This effort began at the on-set of Covid-19, with emergency food walk-ups at the Salvation Army and drive throughs at DuCret Center for Art.

We moved the walk-up operation to Plainfield Parking Lot 7 at Park Avenue and East Seventh Street, where we continued giving out bags of food to 140-160 people every two weeks. The drive-thru at DuCret closed.

Recently, the YMCA was told we had to shut down and vacate the lot by the end of the year. Apparently, the contractor for the Grace Church redevelopment is going to use the lot for construction staging.

The YMCA is looking for another suitable location near downtown, but will temporarily re-locate to the DuCret Center for Arts. If you know of or can help facilitate a downtown location, please contact us at secretary@starfishplainfield.org.

What is Star Fish?

We are a group of volunteers from Plainfield and the surrounding area who belong to a tax exempt, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation in existence since 1971. Star Fish operates three days each week throughout the year, preparing and distributing grocery food orders to an average of thirty to thirty-five families in need each week.

Our primary function is to maintain the food pantry. Our volunteers pack and deliver grocery food orders to clients who have been referred to us by local social service agencies. Most of these agencies are listed on our website <u>Partners page</u>. We also prepare and help give out 150 bags of food twice a month at the walkup Plainfield Food Security Project.

Using a referral system helps us better manage our resources. These agencies vet the client to help assure that our limited resources are given to those truly in need. Our team also prepares special food gift cards for 160 families at Easter, Thanksgiving, and at Christmas. This enables the families to buy food that is appropriate to their heritage and beliefs.

Food We Provide To Those In Need—Items & Amounts Vary Based on Family Size

- 1 Package of frozen meat
- 1 Loaf of bread
- 1 lb of Pasta
- 1 Pasta Sauce
- 1 bag rice
- 2 Cans Soup
- 2 Macaroni and Cheese
- 1 Small bag of tea bags
- 1 Jar Peanut Butter
- 1 Jar Jelly
- 1 Can of Fruit or Jar of Applesauce
- 2 Cans Vegetables
- 2 Can of Tuna
- 2 Cans of Beans
- 1/2 Dozen Eggs
- 2 box of cereal (or 4 Instant Breakfast Cereal envelopes for single persons)
- 1 dry or shelf-stable milk
- Paper goods, cleaning products, and personal care items when available
