Meet the Board of Directors—Sarah Mazzaresse

Sarah is our Board Statistician. She is responsible for assembling the data and preparing the distribution lists for our Holiday Meals Project.

She not only develops the organized lists of clients from worksheets supplied by each Partner Agency, she uses their raw data to determine the value of the ShopRite gift cards going to each family based on their size.



Sarah also uses the data to prepare and print labels that the Holiday Meals Committee applies to envelopes for each client family. She also prepares and prints a special holiday message to go with the gift cards for each family.

Sarah's methods save the Committee hours of work handwriting each envelope for the 160 +/- clients served for the three holiday periods every year.

Sarah started her duties when we were still giving out bags of food for the Holiday Meal Project, with some families receiving 5 or six bags. Her efforts saved many, many more hours at that time because the volunteers had to write the Agency name, family surname, family size, and number of adults and children on 500 or more grocery bags for each holiday! Talk about writer's cramp!!

Sarah has been a director on our Board since 2018 and volunteers for most large-scale projects. She is employed fulltime for twenty-four years at Syneos Health, overseeing an IT Help Desk that provides hardware deployment services and support in the Pharmaceutical Industry.

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If that is not enough, Sarah is also the Board of Trustees President at United Family and Children's Society in Plainfield, an adoption and counseling agency serving Plainfield and the surrounding area.

Sarah is married and the mom of two wonderful kids, a daughter in high school and a son in middle school.

We are grateful for Sarah's enthusiasm, energy, and willing service to Star Fish and the people of Plainfield.

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Plainfield Food Security Project is Moving (Again!)

Our cooperative project with the Plainfield YMCA has found a new location nearer to our former location. We started the PFS project during Covid-19 at the duCret School and the Salvation Army, then moved to Parking Lot 7 at Park Ave. and E. 7th St. where we gave out 140-160 bags of food every two weeks. Then we were told to vacate the lot, and moved temporarily back to duCret. Now, with the assistance of Hannae Wyatt, president of the Board of Education and the Plainfield school district, we have found a location at district-owned property at 504 Madison Avenue. This building is in the downtown area and is located in an area that is walkable for the families from our former location at Lot 7. Thanks to all who made this happen.

What is Star Fish?

We are a group of volunteers from Plainfield and the surrounding area who belong to a tax exempt, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation in existence since 1971. Star Fish operates three days each week throughout the year, preparing and distributing grocery food orders to an average of thirty to thirty-five families in need each week.

Our primary function is to maintain the food pantry. Our volunteers pack and deliver grocery food orders to clients who have been referred to us by local social service agencies. Most of these agencies are listed on our website Partners page. We also prepare and help give out 150 bags of food twice a month at the walkup Plainfield Food Security Project.

Using a referral system helps us better manage our resources. These agencies vet the client to help assure that our limited resources are given to those truly in need. Our team also prepares special food gift cards for 160 families at Easter, Thanksgiving, and at Christmas. This enables the families to buy food that is appropriate to their heritage and beliefs.

Food We Provide To Those In Need—Items & Amounts Vary Based on Family Size

1 Package of frozen meat
1 Loaf of bread
1 lb of Pasta
1 Pasta Sauce
1 bag rice
2 Cans Soup
2 Macaroni and Cheese
1 Small bag of tea bags
1 Jar Peanut Butter
1 Jar Jelly
1 Can of Fruit or Jar of Applesauce
2 Cans Vegetables
2 Can of Tuna
2 Cans of Beans
1/2 Dozen Eggs
2 box of cereal (or 4 Instant Breakfast Cereal envelopes for single persons)
1 dry or shelf-stable milk
Paper goods, cleaning products, and personal care items when available
